



#### To the Elmhurst Community,

The summer still has many opportunities for having fun - I hope you have a chance to take advantage of them. Take a splash at a pool, run through the spray ground at The Hub or pack a picnic for one of your favorite parks.

However - I know many of you are already turning your mind to fall and we at the Park District are looking ahead as well. We're excited for a return of many of our popular fall events and programs.

Of course, we can't start fall without ending summer with a party! Park Palooza is back this year and is a perfect way to wrap-up the season. Join us on Saturday, August 21 from 5-9 p.m. at Berens Park for family games, music on the lawn and a beer garden. Pack a picnic or grab some food from The Hub. A limited number of food trucks will also be available.

This fall, Touch a Truck and Family Fall Fest will make their return. We've also brought back family photo opportunities at Wilder Park Conservatory and Wilder Mansion. Bring the family together for a picture perfect scene at these historic locations.

Also this fall, the Park District is moving forward with construction on two capital projects, the development of Centennial Park and the expansion of Glos Memorial Park, both a direct result of the Park District's Vision 2020 plan.

The Centennial Park plan includes playground equipment for ages 2-5 and ages 5-12, a shelter and plaza with geyser spray features and adult fitness equipment. It will be funded primarily from the \$1,600,000 sale of The Abbey Senior Center to Elmhurst School District #205. The tentative construction timeline is November 2021-April 2022.

Glos Park's expansion is primarily being funded with previously received impact fees from downtown developers totaling \$570,000. Its plan includes landscaping, a pergola with a punched metal roof, a discovery pod including a turtle sculpture and log steppers and additional seating. The tentative construction schedule for the expansion of Glos Park is November 2021-March 2022.

- **4.** Activation of new account is immediate, but will be considered a Non-Resident. Resident Status on account will require proof of residency. Email proof of residency to: registration@epd.org

#### Once you are logged in:

- **1.** Click "Programs" or a "Quick Links" category to search for programs.
- **2.** Under "Activity Search Criteria" you can limit your search or input the program code from the brochure to locate the program.
- **3.** When you have a program listing displayed, you can click on the 'i' to learn more information about the program.
- **4.** Once you find the program you're interested in, click the plus sign to the left of that program to add to your shopping cart.
- **5.** Click 'Add To Cart' on the bottom left of the screen to confirm checkout.

**Note:** If registering with an iPad or mobile device, it is recommended you view the screen in landscape mode. Pop-up windows may not display properly.

#### What are the age requirements?

All program participants must be of the specified age by the first day of class unless otherwise noted.

#### Can I get a refund?

- Withdrawals are due 48 business hour notice unless otherwise noted.
- Refunds must be requested through email.
- Full refunds are issued if a program is cancelled .

#### What if my check is returned?

Any check returned by the bank to the Elmhurst Park District for any reason will incur a \$25 fee. Additional registrations will not be accepted until all outstanding balances have been paid.

#### Is financial assistance available?

The Elmhurst Park District recognizes that there are residents living within District boundaries who are unable to participate in programs due to economic hardships. Applications for financial assistance are online at **epd.org/financial-assistance**.


### Memorials and Gifts






#### Park Bench Memorial Program






#### Lamp Post Memorial Program




In 2020, the Elmhurst Park District brochure went virtual. We wanted to ensure information could be released in a timely manner. Despite being moved online, viewership remained high and even surpassed our expectations. For example, the fall brochure was viewed more than 30,000 times compared to just 3,300 the year prior. This tells us that the community remains very interested in Park District programming and events. The link is also shared to more than 12,500 contacts in Elmhurst. 

- Treating all participants, spectators, parents, District staff and law enforcement with respect and as individuals, regardless of their race, sex, genderidentification, creed or ability.
- Not using any foul, abusive, harassing, sexually suggestive, or intimidating/menacing words, gestures, body language, or behavior towards any participant, spectator, or parent.
- Refraining from and reporting any use of alcohol, tobacco, illegal substances, weapons, or devices that may be used as a weapon.
- Not using violence or unwanted physical contact against a participant, spectator, or parent.
- Controlling and taking responsibility for your actions/inactions and the consequences of your actions.
- Always treating the facilities, equipment, supplies, and property with respect.

Additional rules may be developed for specific activities and leagues as deemed necessary. To ensure the District's programs and facilities remain safe and enjoyable, all reported incidents will be investigated on a case-by-case basis. Participant's, spectator's, and parent's behavior is the responsibility of that individual. Violation of this Code of Conduct or any inappropriate behavior may result in loss of privileges.
