Our annual day of outdoor discovery, Eldridge Adventure Day, is on June 9 and serves as a great kickoff to the summer, reintroducing the community to the parks with bug hunts, a petting zoo and a fishing derby hosted by the Elmhurst Police Department.

Movies in the Park kicks off this year on June 28, with *Mary Poppins Returns*. Head to Wilder Park early to enjoy food trucks, free popcorn and time with family and friends.

The park's paths will also be connected, creating a looped walking trail for visitors.

The Elmhurst Park District offers a variety of swim lessons for ages 6 months to adult. We also offer private swim lessons for ages 3 and older. Early childhood and youth lessons follow the Starfish Swim/Stroke School program, a nationally recognized swim instruction curriculum developed by the Starfish Aquatics Institute. The Starfish Swimming curriculum combines both swimming and water safety skill development to help participants advance their swimming skills.

Which Swim Class is Right for my Child?

Benchmarks are established at each stage of the program to teach swimming and safety skills. Register your child for the program that corresponds with their age.



Starbabies™ – 6-23 months with adult

It is always advisable, especially if the participant is pregnant, disabled in any way or recently suffered an illness, injury or impairment, to consult a physician before undertaking any physical/aquatic activity.

Warning of Risk

Swimming and other aquatic activities challenge and engage the physical, mental and emotional resources of each participant. However, despite careful and proper preparation, instruction, medical advice, conditioning and equipment, there is still a risk of serious injury, including but not limited to drowning, head/brain injury, and cervical spine injury. Understandably, not all hazards and dangers can be foreseen. The very nature of swimming and aquatic activities are hazardous and risky, including but not limited to fatigue and overexertion, poor swimming skills, failing to avoid dangerous areas, failure of lifeguards to locate victims and/or delay in emergency response time, horseplay, diving or cannon-balling into shallow water and striking the bottom or side of the pool or water slide, poor supervision or instruction, lack of conditioning, becoming disoriented, striking other swimmers, defective or inadequate equipment, striking one's head on the bottom when using a diving block, slipping or falling on the deck or within the locker facility, chemical exposure and all other circumstances inherent to aquatic activities and aquatic facilities. In this regard, it must be recognized that it is impossible for the Park District to guarantee absolute safety.

Picnics in the Parks

Many parks in the Elmhurst Park District have areas designated for small group picnics that can accommodate up to eight people and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. These picnic areas typically feature one permanent picnic table on a concrete pad and a nearby grill. Larger picnic areas at Berens, Butterfield, Salt Creek, and Wilder parks can be reserved for exclusive use by obtaining a picnic permit. There is no charge for residents on weekdays and a \$65 charge (\$88 for sheltered areas) for weekend and holiday reservations; the non-resident fee is applicable everyday (\$110 area without shelter, \$140 shelter area). Group picnics with over 100 attendees require a special use permit. Download the application at www.epd.org/picnics-permits. Reservations are only available for large group picnics scheduled from mid-May until the end of October.




