Larger picnic areas at Berens, Butterfield, Salt Creek, and Wilder parks can be reserved for exclusive use by obtaining a picnic permit. There is no charge for residents on weekdays and a \$60 charge (\$83 for sheltered areas) for weekend and holiday reservations; the non-resident fee is applicable everyday (\$105 area without shelter, \$135 shelter area.) Group picnics with over 100 attendees require a special use permit. Download the application at www.epd.org/picnics-permits. Reservations are only available for large group picnics scheduled from mid-May until the end of October.

LAMPPOST MEMORIAL PROGRAM


