CODE of CONDUCT

Participants, spectators, and parents are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior and be respectful of others at all times when using District parks and facilities, including:

- · Abiding by all laws and rules.
- Treating all participants, spectators, parents, District staff and law enforcement with respect and as individuals, regardless of their race, sex, gender-identification, creed or ability.
- Not using any foul, abusive, harassing, sexually suggestive, or intimidating/menacing words, gestures, body language, or behavior towards any participant, spectator, or parent.
- Refraining from and reporting any use of alcohol, tobacco, illegal substances, weapons, or devices that may be used as a weapon.
- Not using violence or unwanted physical contact against a participant, spectator, or parent.
- Controlling and taking responsibility for your actions/inactions and the consequences of your actions.
- Always treating the facilities, equipment, supplies, and property with respect.

Additional rules may be developed for specific activities and leagues as deemed necessary. To ensure the District's programs and facilities remain safe and enjoyable, all reported incidents will be investigated on a case-by-case basis. Participant's, spectator's, and parent's behavior is the responsibility of that individual. Violation of this Code of Conduct or any inappropriate behavior may result in loss of privileges.




Established in 1920, Elmhurst Park

Letter from the Board President ...

On June 5, 1920, an election was held to establish Elmhurst Park District and the first Board of Park Commissioners. The land known as Wilder estate was acquired about a year later, May 5, 1921. It be-came known as Wilder Park and, to this day, is at the center of cultural and recreational life in Elmhurst.

Now, looking ahead to 2020, we're grateful for the opportunity to celebrate our 100th anniversary and to grow the legacy that was established by those who came before us. At the heart of what we do is the community. Engaging Elmhurst in their needs and interests is a way of ensuring that the Park Dis-trict remains a vital piece of the community for the next 100 years.

With Vision 2020, our comprehensive strategic plan, we have listened to residents tell us what they envision as the future of the Park District. We are focused on six possible projects, which were formed based on your feedback:

- Indoor Sports Facility
- Dog Park
- Senior Center
- An expanded Wagner Community Center
- · Acquisition of more open space
- Improved condition and maintenance of Parks and Amenities

At the September 9, 2019 meeting of the Park Board, staff presented implementation plans and finan-cial options for these large-scale projects. After reviewing the financial plans, the Board decided to pursue a voter survey that will determine the level of community support to fund the six projects through a possible referendum in March 2020.

Also in September, the Board approved a contract to purchase a 16-acre site at 837 Riverside Drive, located at the intersection of Route 83 and Riverside Drive, as the potential home of a new indoor sports facility. The contract is contingent on a successful referendum.

The District continues to be interested in gathering feedback from the community. Our website, vision2020.epd.org, is your destination to tell us more and to view project updates and presentations.

This being our 100th anniversary, we are looking forward to celebrating with you all year long, including at our 100th anniversary Community Picnic on Saturday, June 6 in Wilder Park! Follow us on Facebook @ElmhurstParkDistrict or visit epd.org to be the first to hear about other 100th anniversary happenings and check out our Special Events calendar in this brochure to plan a year full of fun.

VISION Focus on the Future

What is Vision 2020?

Vision 2020 is a collaborative community-wide effort to define Elmhurst's priorities and help guide future Park District planning efforts. We're using Park District resources to put your longrange vision into action. Research we conducted to help develop Vision 2020 confirmed that Elmhurst's residents love their parks and want to ensure the facilities and opportunities they enjoy are preserved and improved for current and future generations.

How did the Park District gather community input?

We've gathered your suggestions, ideas and feedback through several points of community input and discussion since our Vision 2020 process began in Fall 2016, such as at open houses and through scientific and online surveys, focus groups and interviews. We also conducted a community needs assessment of current programs, facilities and amenities. We're still listening and want to hear from you. Let us know what your vision for the future of Elmhurst's programs, parks and open space looks like.

How were the six projects chosen?

Your Vision 2020 feedback illuminated several needs and priorities that are important to you. The Park District listened to residents and community stakeholders and used the key findings from that input to guide future planning efforts. The six potential projects outlined here are all high priorities for our community. See the next page for more information on the six projects.

NEW DOG PARK

Park District land on Old York Road offers optimal space for Elmhurst's first off-leash dog park, an amenity many of our neighboring communities already have. Based on your Vision 2020 input, we've formed a master plan with conceptual designs that include separate areas for small and large dogs, a walking path, shaded space and agility equipment.



NEW INDOOR SPORTS FACILITY

Our community wants more indoor sports space, such as a walking track, turf fields, and a gymnasium with hardwood courts. Nearly a third of Elmhurst households don't participate in our programs because the facilities they're looking for aren't available. An indoor sports facility would allow us to serve more members of the community.



NEW ADULT CENTER

Based on community feedback, we determined that we can best address your needs by building a new multi-dimensional adult center. Nearly 60 percent of you support a new facility, which would provide space for expanded adult programming and existing senior programming.



NEW WAGNER COMMUNITY CENTER

You've told us that the Park District needs more programming space, better conditions and more convenient locations. Adding a gym and multipurpose rooms to Wagner Community Center could open up space in other parks and consolidate popular programs.



IMPROVE CONDITIONS AND MAINTENANCE

Elmhurst parks were rated in "fair" condition overall on maintenance and upkeep, while less than half of park amenities earned a high rating on a recent evaluation. More frequent and improved maintenance will protect your vital park assets.



ACQUIRE MORE OPEN SPACE

Elmhurst falls below local, regional and national benchmarks for parks and open space. To narrow the gap, the Park District could add park space and spread it more evenly throughout the community. More than 60 percent of Elmhurst residents surveyed support acquiring land and developing parks in underserved areas throughout the community.

Sandra Jorgensen: Her Garden

January 25 - April 19, 2020

The artist-curator Sandra Jorgensen (1934 - 1999) held positions as professor and chair at Elmhurst College, and curator of the Elmhurst College Art Collection, for many years. As a figure outside of Chicago, her work and influence have largely been overlooked, but her efforts, including curating and promoting the work of the Chicago Imagists, continue to have a major impact nationally and internationally. This survey exhibition of Jorgensen's work--including a series of photos never printed before--will recognize Jorgensen's accomplishments, and will place her work amongst the larger stories of Chicago and Midwestern artists.

As curator Jorgensen was the major driving force behind maintaining and growing the Elmhurst College art collection. In doing so, she became a major caretaker of Chicago's cultural history, and amassed an internationally-known collection now considered "the finest of its kind". Her connoisseurship and vision were critical to the College's art collection, as well as the formation of the Elmhurst Art Museum. She served on the board of the Elmhurst Fine Arts and Civic Center Foundation, the entity that helped start the Elmhurst Art Museum

Could Be Architecture: McCormick AfterParti

January 25 - April 19, 2020

Could Be Architecture, a collaborative duo of Joseph Altshuler and Zack Morrison (Elmhurst), designs "seriously playful spaces, things and happenings that celebrate what your world could be". These designers and educators will create an interactive installation in the McCormick House to invite new and unexpected explorations that reference the home's original 1952 floor plan, such as crouching through a rounded porthole or as a site for a "parti" with culinary wonders. Playful interventions continue throughout the domestic space including a rack of architectural blocks for a youth workshop in the house's playroom space, pull-out seating in the living room, shapely cabinets within the former kitchen, and bed-like features in the bedroom.







Gateway Special Recreation Association (SRA) was formed through an intergovernmental agreement and is an extension of the Park Districts of Elmhurst, Burr Ridge, Oak Brook, Pleasant Dale, Westchester and York Center, the City of Countryside and the Villages of Hinsdale and Willowbrook. Gateway SRA contracts the services of the Ray Graham Association for People with Disabilities, a non-profit agency, to provide recreation programs. PICNICS and RENTALS

PICNICS IN THE PARK

Many parks in the Elmhurst Park District have areas designated for small group picnics that can accommodate up to eight people and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. These picnic areas typically feature one permanent picnic table on a concrete pad and a nearby grill. Larger picnic areas at Berens, Butterfield, Salt Creek, and Wilder parks can be reserved for exclusive use by obtaining a picnic permit. Requests for large group picnic permits for resident groups will be accepted the first business day in January. Application will be accepted until 8 am on the third Monday in January and processed by random draw. Once the procedure is completes, resident requests will be processed daily in the order received. Requests for non-resident groups will be accepted and processed beginning the first business day in February. Reservations are only available for large group picnis scheduled from May until the end of October. There is no charge for residents on weekdays and a \$68 charge (\$90 for sheltered areas) for weekend and holiday reservations; the non-resident fee is applicable everyday (\$115 area without shelter, \$145 shelter area.) Group picnics with over 100 attendees require a special use permit. Download the application at www.epd.org/picnics-permits. Reservations are only available for large group picnics scheduled from mid-May until the end of October.







Bronze plaques are placed at the foot of each tree, and plaque prices vary depending on the size and length of your inscription.

The Elmhurst Park District invites you to honor a loved one or commemorate a special occasion with a permanent engraved brick paver. With seven unique locations to choose from, including the Diana Nicholas Memorial Garden at Wilder Mansion, The Hub at Berens Park, and the Wilder Woodland Walkway, you're sure to find the perfect spot for your message.

PARK BENCH MEMORIAL PROGRAM

Create a dedicated space to commemorate a special person in your life or celebrate a special event with a Park Bench Memorial. Once installed, park benches are marked with a 2" x 4" bronze plague and can be personalized with up to three lines of type. The commemorative park bench serves as a beautiful lasting remembrance that will benefit the community for many years.

LAMP POST MEMORIAL PROGRAM

Framing the Prairie Path, Elmhurst's lampposts light the way for the hundreds of bikers, walkers, runners and nature enthusiasts that traverse its length each day. 




