Park Board Overview

- Seven-member Board elected by the community
- Six-year terms, which stagger every two years
- All board members volunteer and serve without compensation
- Provide strategic long term direction for the District
- Provide oversight and policy rather than day-to-day operations
- Hire Executive Director who reports to the Board of Park Commissioners
- Approve tax levy, budgets and large expenditures
- Seek resident input on large-scale decisions

Boundaries	9.8 square miles
Demographics	Population is approximately 46,387 and the number of households is 16,541
Real Estate	The equalized assessed valuation (EAV) of real estate for 2021 is \$2,805,361,855
Tax Rate	The tax rate for levy year 2021 is 0.3253 per \$100 of assessed value
Bond Rating	Moody's Rating Service issued the District a bond rating of Aa1 in 2017
Fiscal Year Budget	The proposed budget for 2023 is 26,048,307 and the fiscal year is January 1 to December 31






